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Social Housing violations

Performance Report ... A quarter report shows the performance indicators of the Social Housing and Mortgage Finance Fund; The report includes an overview of the most important local and international economic news, the most important media events and the fund's internal activities that took place during the report period, and the performance indicators of the social housing program.

The report also reviews the statement of the total number of beneficiaries and the total number of units allocated, and as part of the fund's efforts to provide various means of communication with its clients, the report presents a statement of the performance of the call center, as well as the total number of messages for the inquiry service via SMS (1124), in addition to a report on The Fund's website activity and the social media pages launched by the Fund to serve its clients and respond to their inquiries, the report included a summary of clients requests and complaints, in addition to social housing violations during the reporting period.

Issue (Apr - Jun) 2021

- The report monitoring the most important local and international economic news that took place during the report period (Apr-Jun 2021) from various sources, whether local sources (Government authorities - advisory institutions local banks) or global sources (international financial institutions - foreign advisory authorities)
- This report shows the results and indicators that have been achieved and highlights the expectations of local and international institutions regarding the Egyptian Economy
- In the 4th quarter of the fiscal year 2020/2021 total number of beneficiaries reached 7,393 beneficiaries; 97.3% of them are benefited from "social housing projects" according to (project type category), while 53% of beneficiaries are aged from 31-40 years old according to (age category) that represents the highest percentage of total number of beneficiaries in this category.
- 35% of the total beneficiaries are working for private sector which is the highest percentage of total number of beneficiaries in (work classification category), while 58.5% of the total beneficiaries are Married with kids, and 28.8% of the beneficiaries their monthly income is between (L.E 1501 L.E 2000) which represents the highest percentage of total number of beneficiaries in (income levels category).
- Positive discrimination is giving for women, women with children, divorced women and widows, 27% of total beneficiaries are females, while beneficiaries from Cairo governorate reached 24.5% of total beneficiaries, that represents the highest percentage of total number of beneficiaries among other different governorates
- The total value of the subsidy granted amounted L.E 148.1 million during the 4th quarter of the fiscal year 2020/2021, with an average value of subsidy provided to each beneficiary by L.E 20 thousand. The total value of the financing granted

amounted was L.E 914 million, with an average value of financing granted to each beneficiary by L.E 122,500.

- 12,335 units have been allocated during 4th quarter of the fiscal year 2020/2021, 12,606 of them are units from Social housing projects, and units with a size of (90 m²) received the highest demanded from beneficiaries which represent 95.5% of the total allocated units.
- level of performance of the call center and customer service reached 93.3%, while the total number of SMS that have been sent to applicants on the (1124) service reached 83,178 SMS, and SHMFF's Facebook page followers reached 206,000 followers, in addition that the total number of visits to the SHMFF Portal reached 8.2 million visits. The Fund launched 19 introductory videos about its services on SHMFF official YouTube channel during the 4th quarter of the fiscal year 2020/2021, with total number of views that reached 48 thousand views.
- SHMFF call center service has received 7,221 requests and 6,704 complaints through the following numbers (090071117 1188 5999 5777), and also received 3,715 complaints & suggestions through different channels represented in (Government complaints portal complaints received from high board complaints received on the ministry's customer service).
- Total number of Violations that have been issued and sent to the Housing Directorates and Cities Authorities reached 1,992 allegations at the end of the report period, the total number of conviction allegation reached 873, and the records of innocence allegation were 77, while 210 allegations were reconciled



Launching the second stage of the national program for economic and social reform

The Egyptian government announced the launch of the second stage of the national program for economic and social reform, under the "Structural Reform Program" within 3 years, starting from April 2021 until the fiscal year 2023/2024, focusing on three economic sectors, technology-intensive manufacturing, agriculture, and communications & information technology.

The program also aims to enhance the concept of the green economy, achieve social protection and develop the Egyptian family

the program seeks to reform 5 systems:

- Legislation system: by working to facilitate, simplify and standardize legislation.
- The demographic system and population characteristics: by developing the education, health system and strengthening social protection.
- Government performance system: by facilitating government transactions and defining the role of the state.
- Logistics system: by improving the efficiency of transportation, logistics to serve citizens and the business community.
- The financing system: by deepening financial inclusion and facilitating access to services.

The Economist Expected that the Egyptian economy performance will improve

The Egyptian economy is expected to improve during the second stage of the economic reform program, according to the latest reports from the Economist on Egypt, which monitored Egypt's economic situation after the pandemic.

The Egyptian government's expected the development plan 2021/2022 improvement in economic performance during the first half of fiscal year 2021/2022, and growth in the second half with control and containment of the pandemic, so their expected economic growth rate would 5.4% in 2021/2022.

The Egyptian economy achieved several successes during the first stage of the economic reform program, which contributed to increasing the GDP, reducing the budget deficit in addition to reducing the state's indebtedness. Over the next three years, the structural reform program will strengthen spending on development projects aimed at improving the standard of living of citizens and improving the services provided to them, along with continuing to support the economic sectors and groups most affected by the CORONA pandemic.

Egyptian exports increase of non-oil products

Egyptian non-oil exports achieved a remarkable increase during the first quarter of 2021 by 6%; Its value amounted \$7.44 billion, compared to \$6.99 billion during the same period in 2020.

Egyptian non-oil imports also increased by 2% to amounted \$16.99 billion, compared to \$16.68 billion during the same period in 2020.

The largest export sectors are as follows: chemical products & fertilizers, with an export value of \$1.53 billion, construction materials sector by \$1.35 billion, food industries by \$0.97 billion, as well as engineering and electronic goods sector by \$0.74 billion.

Egypt Advances in Top 2021 countries rankings

Egypt advanced 3 places in the ranking of the best countries in 2021, as it ranked 33rd out of 78 countries around the world, compared to 36th place in 2020.

Egypt also advanced in most of the sub-categories, including: "Heritage", in which it ranked 8th compared to its 13th rank during the past two years, thanks to recent archaeological discoveries.

The classification is based on determining the preference of 78 countries around the world based on a number of characteristics that have the ability to drive trade, travel, investment and directly affect national economies

Inclusive plan to develop Egyptian families in the coming years

The Ministry of Planning and Economic Development issued a report about the (Development of Egyptian Families National Project), in which it showed that the project includes 5 main axes to be implemented during 3 years (2021-2023) and these axes are as follows:

- Providing Services: by providing family planning methods for free, qualifying a large number of medical staff and distributing them to health facilities.
- Economic Empowerment: by implementation of one million micro-projects led by women, and training 2 million women in project management.
- Legislative path: by developing policies to control population growth, such as criminalizing underage marriage, child labor law, and birth registration.
- Cultural and awareness: by raising the awareness of 6 million women of childbearing age, and educating 2 million prospective couples about the population issue.
- Digital transformation: It aims to create a unified electronic system to automate and link the services provided to the family and integrate them with each of the marriage databases.

Cooperation opportunities between Egypt and the ECOWAS

The Information and Decision Support Center issued a report about trade cooperation between Egypt and the (ECOWAS), in which it showed that the Egyptian trade exchange with ECOWAS amounted to \$491.1 million in 2019, and Egypt's trade surplus with ECOWAS is \$354.1 million during the same year.

The Egyptian state has taken many measures to increase export opportunities with ECOWAS in the coming years, such as:

- Activating the African Continental Free Trade Area Agreement, which entered into force in January 2021.
- Implementing the Jusoor Program for Arab-African Trade to raise awareness of the export opportunities available in Africa.
- Companies such as the Arab Contractors doing more of infrastructure development projects for ECOWAS.
- Implementing the project (Cairo Cape Town) to reduce the time of shipment of goods to 4 days instead of 28 days.
- The Egyptian exports to ECOWAS countries are petroleum oils, gas, electricity meters, installations or parts of facilities, electronic display screens, mixtures of aromatic materials, and non-woven fabrics.

Egypt achieves successful rates in of natural gas homes delivery within three years

The Ministry of Petroleum issued a report on the future of natural gas home delivery in Egypt. It showed that during three years, Egypt achieved successful rates represented in 3.5 million new housing units benefiting from the natural gas, in addition to 2.2 million housing units targeted during current and next year.

The ministry explained that the project aims to expand the delivery of natural gas to homes instead of butane gas bottles. The ministry's initiative is to make citizens pay the cost of gas delivery in installments over a period of 6 years.

The current fiscal year plan has been achieved by connecting gas to 80 new areas, as well as installing 266 thousand prepaid meters, and benefiting 59 villages with natural gas, in addition to 14 villages included in the 2021/2022 plan and 217 other villages.

Egyptian state achievements and efforts in the ICT sector

The Ministry of Communications and Information Technology issued a report on the Egyptian efforts in the ICT sector, the report included the following efforts and achievements:

- Egypt's internet speed ranking has advanced across the African continent from 40th in 2019 to 4th in 2020.
- Establishment the (Egypt Informatics University), the first specialized informatics university in Africa and the Middle East, in the New Administrative Capital.
- Egypt is among the fastest 10 growing countries in digital inclusion in 2020.
- Launching more than 150 digital services from a digital transformation system in Port Said Governorate.
- The new administrative capital is to be the Arab digital capital in 2021

Egypt seeks to become a regional center for gas trade

The International Gas Union issued its report on the future of natural gas in Egypt, it shows that Egypt aims to localize the use of natural gas as a clean source of energy, and seeks to become a regional center for gas trade, especially liquefied gas.

The report shows that the total annual production of natural gas amounted to 74.4 billion cubic meters, with an annual growth rate of 12.4%, while the total annual domestic consumption of natural gas reached 59.9 billion cubic meters.

The most prominent giant gas discoveries in Egypt were (Zohr field - Nawras field - Hammad field), while the most important gas liquefaction and export stations in Egypt were (Idku station - Damietta station).

The total of filling stations with natural gas reached 206 stations at the end of June 2020, while the total vehicles converted to work with natural gas reached 318,000 vehicles at the end of June 2020, and the most important channels of gas consumption (energy production 60% - industrial consumption 23% - petroleum sector 11%)

Egypt continues to advance in renewable energy index

Egypt seeks to maximize the use of renewable energy sources, which are widely available in Egypt, and this was reflected in Country Attractiveness for Renewable Energy Index

The report showed the continued development of Egypt's progression of 9 positions within one year, due to the government's encouragement of its sources to benefit from the contributions of the private sector in the field of energy generation from its renewable and sustainable sources.

The Index indicated that Egypt seeks to reach the contribution of renewable energy sources to 42% of the total energy generated in Egypt, according to Egypt's strategic plan for renewable energy by 2035.

Egypt is among the best countries in the Child Rights Index 2021

Egypt is one of the best countries Child Rights Index 2021, which is issued by the UNICEF in cooperation with the International Institute for Social Studies and Erasmus University of Economics in the Netherlands.

This year, Egypt ranked 34 out of 182 countries around the world, with a total of 0.832 points, while the ranking of the three best countries in the world in the Child Rights Index came as follows: (Iceland - Switzerland - Finland).









■ Social Housing ■ Private Sector ■ Disbursed by SHMFF








■ Private Sector ■ Governmental Sector ■ Self-Employed







6- Total No. Of Beneficiaries According to Gender




